The dog talks how they clash about the music they enjoy but in most other things have similar interests. But there is a difference as we find out, that this is Lola's seeing eye dog, trained to get her through all her everyday struggles. Totally heartwarming and moving.

HEAT OF THE MOMENT BY LORI HANDELAND (St. Martin's Press-\$9.99) 360 pages

This is the second book of the SISTERS OF THE CRAFT series, and there is nothing crafty here, just good old-fashioned romance and magic. Becca Carstairs is a vet whose magical touch can heal. She can also hear animals' voices. When animals vanish, and murderous intent is out there, can she cope? Add a man who broke her heart a decade back and you have the recipe for more than magic. Tension grips every page.

BEYOND THE POOL OF STARS BY HOWARD ANDREW JONES (Tor-\$17.50) 360 pages

This is another in the line of books that are based on the popular Pathfinder roleplaying games. The novels have the same intensity and action. BEYOND THE POOL OF STARS features Mirian Raas a salvager, who has come to look for treasure to support her family. But this trip for treasure is deadlier and more dangerous than ever. There is more than her life at stake, as a nation awaits the outcome as well.

HOME FOR CHRISTMAS BY LILY EVERETT (St. Martin's Press-\$9.99) 312 pages
